MAJOR DANIEL J. WILLIAMS MARINE CORPS RECRUIT DEPOT/ WESTERN RECRUITING REGION, SAN DIEGO, CALIFORNIA

Major Williams was born on 2 January 1983 in Tacoma, WA. He enlisted in the Marine Corps on 8 July 2002. Following Basic Training and Aviation Ordnance Technician School, he reported to Marine Medium-Helicopter Squadron 262, Okinawa, Japan in July 2003. During this tour, Major Williams served as Ordnance Technician and Supply Expeditor in

support of operations in the Philippines and South Korea.

In July 2004, Major Williams was transferred to Marine Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Squadron 1, MCAGCC Twentynine Palms, CA where he served as Ordnance Technician, Hazmat Supervisor, Maintenance Controller, and deployed twice in support of Operation IRAQI FREEDOM.

In May of 2006, Major Williams was accepted to the Marine Enlisted Commissioning Education Program (MECEP) and reported to Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, CA for MECEP Prep, with follow-on orders to Reserve Officer Training Corps, University of Washington, Seattle, WA. Major Williams met his now wife, Hellen, when he was conducting MECEP Prep in 2006.

He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps in August 2009, having completed his undergraduate education in Public Health at the University of Washington. He and Hellen were married two months before his commissioning on 12 June 2009 in Escondido, CA.

Following The Basic School and the Air Support Control Officer Course, he was assigned to Marine Air Support Squadron 3, Camp Pendleton, CA in August 2010. During this tour, Major Williams served as a Platoon Commander, Safety Officer, and deployed in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM.

In July 2013, Major Williams was transferred to Marine Corps Communication-Electronics School, MCAGCC Twentynine Palms, CA where he served as an Instructor and Training Officer for Air Support Operations Operator's Course and Air Support Control Officer's Course.

Ordered to MCAS Miramar, CA in July 2016, Major Williams served as Marine Tactical Air Command Squadron 38 Adjutant, Legal Officer, and Tactical Air Command Center Operations Officer-in-Charge. Major Williams subsequently reported as Headquarters Company Commander, Marine Air Control Group 38, MCAS Miramar, CA in August 2018.

In July 2019, Major Williams was reassigned to Marine Corps Logistics Operations Group, MCAGCC Twentynine Palms, CA where he served as Curriculum Developer for the Advanced Expeditionary Logistics Operations Course.

Major Williams conducted a final move in 2021 to HQSVCBN, MCRD-SD, where he served as Service Company Commander. He retires after 22 years of honorable service.

Major Williams and his wife, Hellen, live in Escondido, CA with their two children: LeeRoy 22 and Mia 13.
