MCRD bids farewell to the Chevron

With history comes memories, and the Chevron newspaper has plenty of both. Although the life of the Chevron has come to an end, there's still plenty of room to reminisce.

On behalf of the Chevron Staff, past and present, we say our final goodbyes to the Chevron newspaper at MCRD San Diego with this final edition.

The Chevron began Jan. 10, 1942, as a way for news to be passed to those around the depot. Through more than 75 volumes and numerous editions, the paper has provided a plethora of information about the Marine Corps, and fundamentally, recruit training.

"I remember it being 22 pages on average," said Ellen M. Guillemette, historian, MCRD San Diego

Command Museum. "It also used to be published on Saturdays instead of Fridays."

Over the years, Chevron staff members have had many experiences with the paper, and memories of its different phases still remain.

"[I remember one Thursday], my computer was [running] slow, and so a Marine from Information Technology Support came in and [accidentally] erased everything, including that week's paper," said Sgt. Pete Voss, former Chevron staff member. "[That night], from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., the entire Chevron staff, fueled by Mountain Dew, worked together to ensure the paper was reconstructed and delivered to the printer in just enough time to get it to the graduating class that

Friday morning."

Through the years, staff members have dedicated themselves to getting articles and material to fill the Chevron pages and get it published on time.

"[There was a time when] the whole crew spent an entire weekend at the Weapons and Field Training Battalion [at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, Calif.] following the first Crucible with the media," said Staff Sgt. Brandon Swenson, former Chevron staff member. "We ended up sleeping on cots in the classrooms down there. I'm sad to see the old paper go."


Gradually through the years the Chevron has downsized in length, and its main focus has centered itself on recruit training.

"It's probably a result of [the transition to] social media," said Guillemette. "Since the mid-1990s, the Chevron has included things such as the graduation lists with the platoon rosters of the Marines graduating that week, and I suppose that'll be one thing leaving, too. I actually read the Chevron online every week, so I'm going to miss it."

As the Public Affairs Office transitions to a digital/social media medium, we bid farewell to the paper many have read over the years.

For the final edition, we'll be taking a look back and highlighting the Chevron one last time by revisiting works from the past. Enjoy the "mashup" version of the Chevron, mixing features from the past and present.

H Co. sights in on rifle range

Once recruits reach the second phase of training, they take on the challenge of becoming a rifleman at Edson Range, Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Recruits of Hotel Company, 2nd Recruit Training Battalion, were taught the basic fundamentals of firing the M16-A4 Service Rifle during Grass Week under the instruction of Marines known as primary marksmanship instructors.

The marksmanship instructors teach recruits the fundamental techniques such as breathing control, stability and how to properly squeeze the trigger.

"Every Marine is rifleman," said Recruit David A. Busenbark. "It's a basic standard every Marine needs to be proficient in to protect each other and to protect our country."

Once PMIs completed the classroom instruction, recruits moved to a semi-circular area to begin snapping in, allowing them to practice the fundamentals they had just learned. The area surrounds a white barrel painted with different size targets. The targets simulate what they look like from distances of 200, 300 and 500 yards, the exact distances recruits will use when firing.

Recruits spend several hours snapping in, which allows them to gain confidence in different shooting positions as well as muscle memory and helps become comfortable in the different positions.

"The fundamentals feel uncomfortable at first, but after you've been in each position for long periods of time, it starts to feel like second nature," said 24-year-old Busenbark. "The all-around training we receive for the range builds us as sound marksmen."

Once Grass Week is over, re-

cruits move on to Firing Week where they apply the fundamental marksmanship principles they learned on a live-fire range and qualify with their weapon with their weapon in order to move forward with training.

"It starts and ends with the basics," said Recruit Shelby M. Jones.

"The instructors break the fundamentals down for us and coach us through every step of shooting."


During rifle qualification, recruits fired the M16-A4 service rifle from the 200, 300 and 500-yard lines utilizing four different shooting positions: standing, kneeling, sitting and prone.

Firing Week is the first time recruits are able to fire their weapons in recruit training. They are given several days to polish their skills before recording an official score.

Qualifying is not only important for recruits in order to continue with training as Marines are required to qualify annually to ensure they are combat-ready, proving the saying that every Marine is a rifleman.

Throughout Rifle Week, recruits plot all of their shots into a data book, which depicts where their shots impacted the target. This helps recruits make the appropriate adjustments for a more accurate shot.

Lessons learned during grass week and firing week of recruit training are used throughout a Marine's career. For that reason, it is important for recruits to retain all the knowledge PMIs teach. With the instruction and coaching, recruits are set up for success to move forward in becoming United States Marines.

After recording their sizes, the recruits lined up to receive the uniform and returned to the designated area for changing, fitting and tailoring.


"At first, we weren't really focused on looking nice, but that kind of changes for some reason
